In other words, in many ways it's like herding cats...

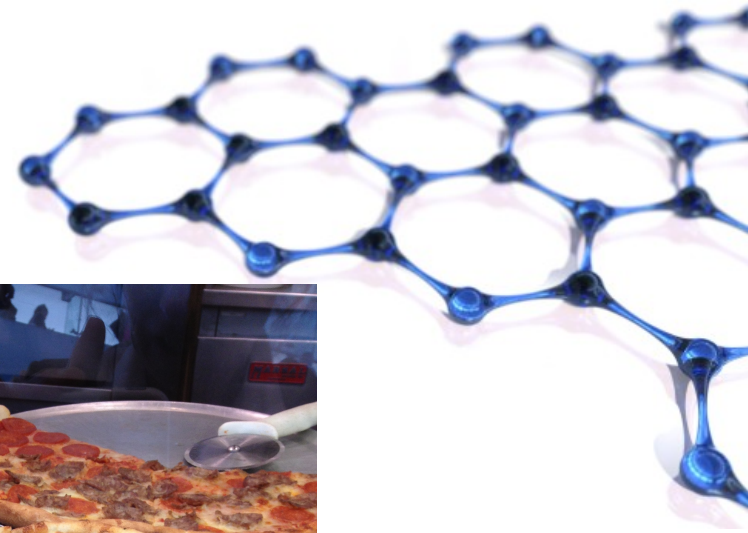

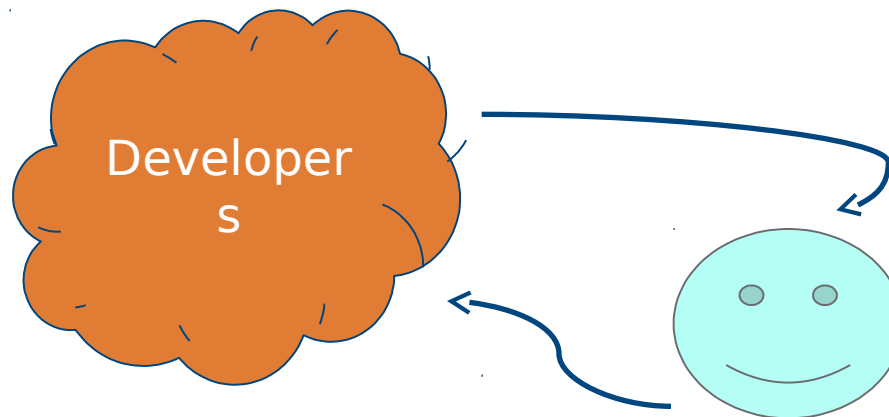

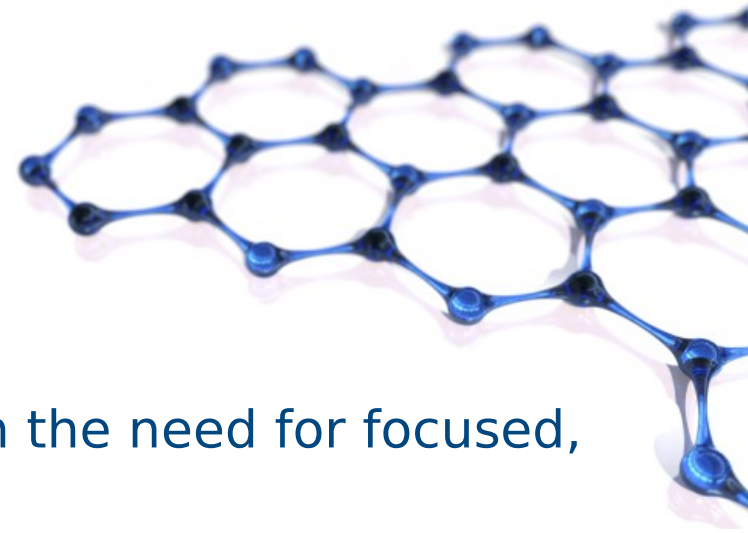

The Challenge:



- **In development:**

- Balance the goal of inclusiveness with the need for focused, experienced skill-set
- Keep up energy and involvement over a long period of uneven progress

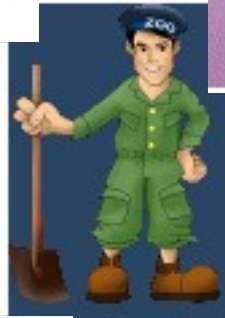
- **In deployment:**

- End users must be aware of project and see benefit in trying it
- End users need to understand how to put it to use

- **For maturity and beyond:**

- Active exchange between user experience and ongoing development
- Long term involvement of developers and committers after GA
